GENERAL INFORMATION

A liquor licence does not override local laws, planning schemes and conditions on planning permits. It is the licensee's responsibility to ensure they comply with these.

TYPE OF LICENCE

This licence is a late night (on-premises) licence and authorises the licensee to supply liquor on the licensed premises for consumption on the licensed premises during the trading hours specified below.

AMENITY

The licensee shall not cause or permit undue detriment to the amenity of the area to arise out of or in connection with the use of the premises to which the licence relates during or immediately after the trading hours authorised under this licence. The licensee shall ensure that the level of noise emitted from the licensed premises shall not exceed the permissible noise levels for entertainment noise as specified in the State Environment Protection Policy (Control of Music Noise from Public Premises) No.N-2.

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

- This licence is not effective until a planning permit has been granted by the local council (or responsible planning authority) or evidence from the local council (or responsible planning authority) that a planning permit is not required is provided to the Commission.
- Within 7 days of gaining the legal right to use the premises as licensed premises, the licensee must notify the Commission by lodging a completed copy of a Notice of right to use premises form.
- If the licensee fails to gain the legal right to use the premises as licensed premises by 06/07/2022 the licence remains not effective indefinitely and a new application for a liquor licence will need to be lodged.

The licensee shall install and maintain a surveillance recording system able to clearly identify individuals, which shows time and date and provides continuous images of all entrances and exits, bars and entertainment/dance floor areas. The surveillance recording system must operate from 30 minutes before the premises opens to the public, until 30 minutes after closure. A copy of the recorded images must be available upon request for immediate viewing or removal by the Victoria Police, or a person authorised in writing by the Victorian Commission for Gambling and Liquor Regulation, or otherwise retained for at least one month. The positioning of all cameras shall be to the satisfaction of the Licensing Inspector. Signs, as described below, are to be displayed in all areas subject to camera surveillance. Such signs shall read: "For the safety and security of patrons and staff this area is under electronic surveillance".

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

Alcohol is not to be consumed in the rear yard at any time.
No amplified music or loudspeakers are permitted in the rear yard.

MAXIMUM CAPACITIES

100 patrons.

Monday to Thursday	Between 7am and 1am the following morning
Friday to Sunday	Between 7am and 3am the following morning
Good Friday	Between 12noon and 3am the following morning

Trading hours on ANZAC Day must not commence before 12noon and must cease no later than the finishing times specified above.
